RE: Lapeer High School and PM Bus #23

Parents and Staff --

We received confirmation that three students at Lapeer High School have tested positive for COVID-19. The students were present at Lapeer High School January 27-29. One student was present on PM Bus #23 on January 28-29. District officials, in coordination with the Lapeer County Health Department (LCHD), have identified any students or staff members who have been in close contact (within six feet for more than 15 minutes) with the students. **Those individuals have been contacted directly and will be required to quarantine per our health and safety guidelines.**

The District will continue to cooperate with LCHD to assist in contact tracing and notification if there are additional positive school-associated cases. The District will maintain strict enforcement of health and safety guidelines in order to limit transmission of COVID-19.

We ask that all parents check students for symptoms daily prior to sending them to school. Any student or staff member exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19 should stay home. *COVID- 19 symptoms include fever, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, and diarrhea.*
