EAST ALLEN CAREER CENTER

The East Allen Career Center opened this fall with five distinct programs and over 140 students. Located in the former New Haven Intermediate/Meadowbrook building, the Career Center is an option for juniors and seniors across the district. Students attend the Career Center for half of the day and their home high school for the other half. Transportation is provided for students coming from an EACS high school.

All of the programs are Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs. This means that students are learning and practicing skills that prepare them for a specific career field. In addition to career preparation, students can earn up to one year's worth of dual college credit.

The programs are designed to give students as many options as possible as they explore their career interests. Partnerships with local businesses have been established and some students have already secured paid internships. Students who are serious about getting a jump start on college or their career will find many opportunities at the East Allen Career Center.
