## WEST CARROLL PARISH DUAL ENROLLMENT

### \*\*\*\*\*NOTICE TO PARENTS\*\*\*\*\*

The West Carroll Parish School Board is pleased to announce that, in conjunction with the University of Louisiana at Monroe (ULM) and Louisiana Delta Community College, there is a program for college-bound students that allow them to simultaneously earn credit toward high school graduation and credit toward college graduation. The program is available to high school juniors and seniors who meet the criteria for admission established by the post-secondary institute to be attended by the student.

Generally, students must meet the following criteria in order to be eligible to participate in the Dual Enrollment Program:

1. The student must be currently enrolled in the 11<sup>th</sup> or 12<sup>th</sup> grade.
2. The student must be on track for completing the Regents/TOPS high school core curriculum.
3. The student must have taken the PLAN or ACT assessment, and the student's test scores must be on file at the school.
4. The student must be enrolled in a course for which both college and high school credit is available.

Toward that end, every eligible student with a GPA of 2.0 or higher will, upon request, be recommended by the principal of his/her school for participation in the program if they otherwise meet the admission criteria of the participating college or university.
